CEO APPOINTMENT

The MDAS Board has announced the appointment of Darlene Thomas as Chief Executive, after a rigorous recruitment process, led by an independent Indigenous recruitment agency – Pipeline Talent.

In an indication of the reputation MDAS is developing as an employer of choice and a place of impact and opportunity, there were 17 applications for the position of Chief Executive and of those, Pipeline narrowed the field to a short list of 6 applicants, four of whom were then offered interviews.

The Interview Panel included highly regarded external professionals who brought with them great insight and experience and together they identified the candidate who would be best placed to continue to guide MDAS on its journey. MDAS was seeking someone who is values driven, and who will conduct themselves and expect of others, a high degree of transparency, accountability, integrity and innovation.

After careful consideration, the Board unanimously voted to accept the final

recommendation of the Panel, and of Pipeline Talent, to offer the position to Darlene.

The Board is excited that Darlene has accepted the role and they're confident she'll deliver great things both for MDAS and the communities it serves. Darlene has established relationships with key partners and stakeholders and has an enduring commitment to working to achieve better outcomes for our Mob. She has embedded community engagement and respect in all her work at MDAS for several years and has proven herself to be a stable and honest contributor. Darlene will continue to drive positive change for the Organisation and has the strength and support of her Executive, senior leadership and staff, to fulfil a shared vision for the future of our community and for MDAS.

Floods, bugs and viruses


